BUPA Mildura nurses and carers will stop work from 7am tomorrow as part of a second wave of protected industrial action, along with eight other Bupa nursing homes across Victoria.

Mildura workers wore campaign t-shirts and handed out materials to the community last week as part of the ongoing campaign for improved staffing levels, skill mix and better wages and conditions.

Nurses and carers will continue this action along with 25 other Victorian Bupa facilities.

The Australian Nursing and Midwifery Federation (ANMF) said workers were campaigning for wages that match industry stand-

care when patient workloads are too high," ANMF Victorian secretary Lisa Fitzpatrick ard rates paid at Bupa's competitors, including BlueCross and Arcare.

"Bupa nurses and carers are escalating their action to ensure Victorians understand the stress, the difficulties and the reality of missed care when patient workloads are to

The ANMF said negotiations for a new enterprise agreement had been hampered after Bupa this week announced it would be making redundancies across Australia.

However, Bupa Aged Care Australia's chief nurse Maureen Berry rejected the ANMF's claims that it was linked to industrial action.

"Bupa is currently consulting with a small number of managers across our homes about proposed changes to the clinical manage-

"The proposal is to create new role of clinical care manage by consolidating existing clinical manager roles."
On the separate matter our wage negotiations with out Victorian workforce, we continut to negotiate in good faith with th Unions. Our latest offer include an 11.25 per cent wage increas over three years, and protection copenalty rates including weeken loadings. The ANMF doesn't accept this offer."
